
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STEPPING UP **TO PANGBOURNE**

A bright, homely and welcoming building, Dunbar is located separately from the older pupils' Divisions, and has its own extensive grounds of green meadow and woodland called the 'Piggeries'. The shared social area has been designed to enable the pupils to relax and study, but also have fun, with a range of activities available both inside and outside the Division.

Dunbar is split into four 'Watches' (Port, Starboard, Forward and Aft) who compete in challenges against one another. They each have their own Watch Captain (a prefect in Year 8) providing early leadership opportunities. To further friendly competition and maintain high standards, there are weekly uniform and dormitory inspections to help prepare pupils for this process when moving up to the Senior Divisions.

Our boarding structure is a key part of our pastoral provision. At Dunbar, boarders and day pupils are fully integrated in the Division. This integration creates a strong sense of community and belonging, enabling strong friendships to form and grow. Dunbar offers different boarding options, including occasional nights, to enable pupils to experience their first taste

CURRICULUM

During their time in Dunbar, pupils receive a grounding in all the key academic subjects, giving them a broad range of learning that embraces individual interests and strengths. Pupils benefit from the expertise of subject specialists, with experience of teaching the curriculum across all year groups.

Dunbar pupils have access to the same learning facilities as the older pupils, this arrangement helps with the smooth transition from junior into senior education. Our friendly, experienced staff are dedicated to making sure this considerable change is as easy as possible for your child.

Where pupils demonstrate high academic abilities, they are invited to work towards the Dunbar Project Qualification (DPQ). The qualification includes a project on a subject of the pupil's choice along with Theory of Knowledge lessons. The DPQ offers prospective Academic Scholars in Year 7 a pathway to our HPA programme.

NACE

In Summer 2023, Pangbourne College was accredited with the NACE Challenge Award. Pangbourne is one of only two independent Senior Schools, with a Sixth Form, in England to have this award. The award has been given in recognition of our commitment to high-quality provision for more able learners, within the context of challenge for all. It demonstrates that at the heart of the College's offering pupils are challenged and given the opportunity to excel in whatever field they are working.

Outside the classroom, co-curricular activities play a very important role in life at Pangbourne. They enhance our fantastic community, create the spirit of 'Team Pangbourne', demonstrate our Flag Values, and help pupils to develop positive characteristics and life skills.

Our extensive Activities Programme offers our pupils lots of opportunities to pursue their interests and to develop new ones. There is a very broad range of options to choose from including the creative arts, sciences, bushcraft, mindfulness and self-care, orienteering, and design technology.

Whilst in Dunbar, pupils will have the opportunity to get involved in other areas of school life, including music and drama productions, as well as sporting and academic competitions. Parents are also able to meet and get to know one another through regular social events including the start of term barbeque, family quiz, and Dunbar Dinner.

Dunbar pupils will participate in Physical Education (PE) once a week and in Games almost every day. Pangbourne offers many sporting opportunities to pupils as they progress through the school, especially team sports. These options range from athletics to swimming, riding to clay pigeon shooting.



SUPPORT EVERY STEP OF THE WAY


