ABOUT THE MARCHING

Some people may think that we are a naval college or perhaps even a military school, but neither is true!

Although we were founded in 1917 by a shipping company to prepare 'cadets' for careers in the Merchant Navy, we have been an all-round, independent school since 1969.

However, we have retained some of our distinctive ceremonial traditions which include parades seven times a year. These traditions make a big contribution to our ethos and our strong community spirit. They also embed and develop key life skills which are essential for life beyond College, such as:

- 1. Confidence: parades are performances in which, over time, students improve and enjoy performing.
- 2. Self-discipline: this is developed as students learn to prepare themselves and their younger peers for the event.
- 3. Teamwork: parades depend on everyone in the College (in Year 9 and above) playing their part, and working together as a team.
- **4.** Leadership: senior pupils teach the juniors what is expected of them, model the standards themselves, and take on leading roles.

We understand that parades may not be for everybody, but it is often after students have left Pangbourne that they recognise how valuable the experience has been, and the contribution that it has made to their lives.
